What is this and how do I use it?

Q: What is a QR code?

A: QR stands for Quick Response – it is a two-dimensional bar code.

Q: How do I scan it?

A: Launch a QR Code reader app on your smartphone and wait until the camera detects it. Within seconds the encoded content is displayed on the screen. Dear Pomaika`i Ohana,

Happy New Year! The start of the year is a time for me to look at where we've been and to imagine where I want to go. Even though January is in the middle of our school year, it's still a time for reflection and planning. I want to share some thoughts on our Pomaika`i ("blessed") learning journey with you.

Under Hawaii's Strive HI Performance System, Pōmaika'i Elementary is once again a top 5% Recognition School. Our scores are not as high as last year, but we are proud to be still ranked #1 of elementary schools on Maui. We have a high number (68%) of students meeting proficiency on the HSA Science test (4th grade); and above 70% on the SBA tests, (3rd, 4th, and 5th grade). We also had a low number of student absences (excused or not) at 11%, which roughly translates to 55 students being out 15 or more days of school. Being a Recognition School is a testament to our focus on our vision, mission, and commitment to our children's successes. We will continue to improve as we include more "hands on" and collaborative learning opportunities that utilize critical thinking skills and active learning strategies in all of our classes.

To have successful students, we will continue to support our teachers through professional development opportunities. Most recently, on our January 6, 2016th Professional Development day, we were inspired by internationally-sought-after presenters on assessment-- Anne Davies and Sandra Herbst! The investment in our teachers over the years is proven to yield positive outcomes for our students.

There are also State Department of Education-initiated strategies that have a positive impact on student learning. Data Teams and common formative assessments enhance the data driven decision-making process toward improvement. The Common Core State Standards are addressed in all grades, K-5; and the Smarter Balanced Assessment is changing the way we assess students as they respond to problems. And our Academic Review Team broadens leadership skills and awareness of the entirety of our school as they plan, do, act, and check our academic and financial plans.

Overall, our academic scores beg the question: Why are we not at 100% where ALL of our children meet or exceed proficiency? We still have a way to go on our learning journey. As we make the shift to the Common Core Standards, new Smarter Balanced Assessment, and Strive HI accountability system, we will continue to focus on educating all of our children with Arts Integration strategies that focus on critical thinking and active learning. The Academic Review Team, PTSA, SCC (School Community Council), and other leadership teams at Pomaika`i Elementary School will continue to make adjustments on our journey throughout the year as we strive toward student improvement.

I'm glad you're here to join us on our learning journey by supporting our students and our school! With joy in our hearts for the blessings we've enjoyed, condolences for the losses we've had this past year, I have much hope for a 2016 that is filled with lots of love, cheer, and learning!
